What is it about Jesus that makes you want to give your allegiance to him no matter what others say or do?

What fruits of righteousness might flow in your life this week as you give your allegiance to Christ above all others?

What different ways might we be tempted to be like the Pharisees in questioning and testing Jesus?

#### **WEEK 3- DAY 5**

Read Mark 8:22-33

How is Peter like the blind man who Jesus heals?

According to Jesus, as the Christ (King), he must die. It was the only way for our sins to be forgiven. What does this teach us about Jesus?

What sins might result from a failure to grasp and appreciate this truth?

What are you being told about Jesus for which you can praise him?

Here are some more Old Testament verses that may help us understand what's happening in Mark.

Exodus 16

#### **WEEK 4- DAY 1**

Read Mark 8:34-38

What is Jesus saying about himself?

What is Jesus saying about you?

Are you being told anything about yourself that you need to repent from?

What assurance from Christ is given to you in these verses?

(You may want to check out Daniel 7:1-13 and compare with Mark 8:38)

### **WEEK 4- DAY 2**

Read Mark 9:1-13

How did Peter, James and John see the kingdom of God come in power on this day?

What do we learn about Jesus from the voice from the cloud? From Jesus himself?

What fruits of righteousness might flow into your life from these truths?

What are you being told about Jesus for which you can praise him?

#### **WEEK 4- DAY 3**

Read Mark 9:14-32

What words would you use to describe Jesus from these verses?

Have you ever felt like the boy's father in verse 24?

What helps you to trust in Jesus when life is hard?

Jesus teaches his disciple for a second time that he's going to die (v31). What assurance is Christ giving to you that he would let evil have its way with him in your place? **Pray** about the passage, about your day ahead.

## **WEEK 4- DAY 4**

Read Mark 9:33-41

What do we learn about Jesus in these verses?

What do we learn about his kingdom?

What do we learn about what Jesus wants from his people?

What assurance from Christ is given to you in these verses?

#### **WEEK 4- DAY 5**

Read Mark 9:42-50

How do these verses make you feel about Jesus?

Is there anything you need to ask for forgiveness for or need to repent of?

What happens in your heart and mind when you forget that sin is this serious?

#### **WHAT NEXT?**

Well done - that's another 20 days in God's word!

What have you found helpful about having a daily habit of reading God's word?

What's been hard?

What's been something you've learned about God or yourself?

Keep it up! You can keep reading God's word, just pick a small section each day, a chapter, a few verses.

As you can see reading it in order helps - just like you'd read a normal book. That way if you don't understand something it may become clearer as you read on. This is better than just randomly opening to somewhere in the Bible and reading.

After you read, reflect on it, think about why this part of the Bible is there, what's God wanting to show you, and then pray!

Other parts of the bible you might like to try as a new Bible reader:

Genesis, Exodus, Luke, Acts, Ephesians, Colossians.
