We Meet Together with God

Possible Ice Breaker: You've been exiled to a deserted island for a year. You are told you may take three things you want, apart from the essentials. What would you take and why.

As a growth group, we want to prioritise hearing God speak to us, together. In groups of 2 or 3, read the following verses and write down what you notice about hearing God's word as his people. Share with the group what you find.

Matthew 7:24

2 Timothy 3:16-17

Colossians 3:16

James 1:22-25

Last week, the writer of Hebrews highlighted the importance of Christians continuing to meet together. What could be the benefit of hearing God's word as a group of Christians, rather than in isolation?

How might these verses inform our priorities for growth groups this year, as we seek to live now for eternity?

Spend time praying together for your group as you seek to gather around God's word this year.

We Meet Together to Grow

Possible Ice Breaker: If you had to describe how your week is going as an amusement park ride, what ride are you on right now?

As a growth group, we want to prioritise growing in our relationship with God. What are some possible indicators of a healthy growth group?

Read Ephesians 4:11-16

Why did Christ give certain leaders to his people?

How would you describe a group of God's people from verses 11-16?

From this passage, what are God's people to try to do?

How are they to do this?

How does this passage impact the way we think about our growth group this year?

Spend time praying together for your group as you seek to grow in maturity as you wait for eternity.

We Meet Together in Love

Possible Ice Breaker: What gameshow or reality TV show do you think you'd be great at?

God calls his people to meet together and gives us a picture of how we are to relate to one another.

Break up into groups of 2 or 3 and break up the following verses among the pairs. In your pairs, write down what your verses say about *why* we meet and/or *how* we should relate to one another. (Not all verses will address both the why and how).

Then share what you find with the group.
